



MATHEMATICS INSTRUCTOR

POSITION

This is a full-time, 175 day (10-month annual contract) tenure-track faculty position in the Mathematical Sciences Department. The instructor provides instruction in mathematics (any course in the mathematics sequence from developmental through calculus including statistics, and assignment in the Math Center); provides outreach and articulation with district high schools and with four-year colleges and universities; evaluates and advises students; plans and organizes instructional materials toward course objectives; participates in program review, and assessment, curriculum development; maintains five (5) office hours weekly for student consultation; participates fully in department and college activities, including membership on campus-wide committees; maintains class and examination schedules, as well as grade and attendance records, according to college regulations; and performs related duties as required. The assignment may include teaching at off-campus centers and/or evening and weekend classes.

SALARY AND FRINGE BENEFITS

- 1 Hiring salary range is \$48,736 to \$69,854 depending upon education and experience. A doctoral stipend of \$2,000 is paid to those who qualify.

QUALIFICATIONS PROFILE

Minimum Qualifications

- Master's or higher degree in mathematics or applied mathematics; OR a bachelor's in either of the above AND a master's in statistics, physics, or mathematics education; OR the equivalent; OR a valid California community college instructor credential authorizing full-time service as a mathematics instructor.
- Sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, cultural, and ethnic backgrounds of community college staff and students and to staff and students with disabilities
- Experience in the instruction of mathematics
- Ability to function well in a technology driven environment
- Ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing
- A commitment to establish and maintain cooperative and supportive working relationships with colleagues and students

Desired Qualifications

- Experience teaching students having a broad range of skills, motivation, learning styles and/or academic and vocational goals
- Experience incorporating current technology i.e.: graphing calculators and computers into instruction
- Experience and enthusiasm for teaching developmental mathematics

- Experience teaching a variety of mathematics including arithmetic, algebra, calculus and statistics

In its desire to select outstanding faculty members from the largest possible pool of qualified applicants, Allan Hancock College recognizes the fact that candidates may have attained expertise in a discipline through a variety of means. Certain combinations of education, experience, and other accomplishments in the field may be judged by the district as equal to the above stated qualifications for this position. Candidates who feel they possess such equivalent qualifications are encouraged to complete the equivalency form and provide appropriate documentation of their qualifications.

SCREENING PROCESS

A committee will review applications. Meeting the stated qualifications does not assure a candidate an interview. Therefore, it is important that the application be thorough and detailed. Applicants will be assessed on the breadth and depth of education, training, experience, skills, knowledge and abilities. A limited number of applicants will be invited for an interview at the college at their own expense. All interviewed candidates will be asked to present a short teaching demonstration. Final candidates may be required to pass a pre-employment drug screening.

APPLICATION PERIOD

All application materials must be received at the college human resources office **by 4:30 p.m. Monday, February 6, 2012.**

A committee will review application materials as soon as possible after the published deadline. The district reserves the right to extend time limits, reinstate, or withdraw the recruitment/selection process at any point.

- 4 Letter of interest

The successful candidate must pass department of justice clearance and a pre-employment health and physical before start date.
